

TECHNIQUE PRINCIPLES

Clean

Non-Invasive procedures

LOW RISK OF INFECTION



Aseptic

Brief invasive surgery

MODERATE RISK OF INFECTION



Sterile

Lengthy invasive surgery

HIGH RISK OF INFECTION



Clean Technique

- Dry Socket Tx
- Exam
- Impressions
- Radiographs
- Suture Removal
- Vital Signs

PROTOCOL:

- ✓ Hand Wash ✓ Non-Sterile Gloves
- ✓ Mask
- ✓ Clean/Sterile Eqt

Aseptic Technique

- Biopsy
- Debride, I & D
- Exposure
- Extraction
- Implant Uncover/Test
- Jaw Wire

PROTOCOL:

- ✓ Hand Wash
- ✓ Alcohol Rub ✓ Non-Sterile Gloves
- ✓ Mask
- ✓ Clean/Sterile Eqt
- ✓ Dedicated Area

Sterile Technique

- Bone Graft - Bone Plates
- Implant Placement
- Orthognathic Sx
- Sinus Graft
- Soft Tissue Graft

PROTOCOL:

- ✓ Surgical Scrub
- ✓ Sterile Gloves & Gown
- ✓ Mask
- ✓ Head Cover
- ✓ Patient Mouth Rinse
- ✓ Patient Skin Prep
- ✓ Sterile Eqt
- ✓ Dedicated Op

Remember to apply the procedure's technique PROTOCOL to reduce the risk of



PROTOCOL	Clean	Aseptic	Sterile
Procedure Field	Operatory, X-ray room	Dedicated AREA of operatory	Dedicated operatory
Equipment	Clean/Sterile	Sterile	OPEN Sterile
Gloves	Non-sterile	Non-sterile	Sterile
Hand wash	Yes	Yes Alcohol rub	Yes Surgical scrub
Patient skin antisepsis	No	No	Yes
Sterile gown	No	No	Yes
Mask and head covering	Mask only	Mask only	Yes
